

Information on Directive 2012/19/EU on waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE)

What does WEEE mean?

WEEE stands for “Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment”. Implementation of the WEEE Directive of the European Union commenced in the EU Member States in August 2005. This Directive contains regulations on the recycling and correct disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment by manufacturers. The WEEE Directive is implemented by the individual national governments.

WEEE guidelines of CeoTronics

CeoTronics offers products in Category 4 (large devices for exclusive use in other than private households) and products in Category 6 (small devices of information and telecommunications technology for exclusive use in other than private households), which, in accordance with the WEEE Directive, are deemed to be commercially used items (“Business to Business”). As a producer, CeoTronics has implemented certain recycling/disposal procedures, including registration with the official institute in Germany, so that the equipment and devices are recognised in accordance with the Directive. The registration number (WEEE number) of CeoTronics AG is the WEEE Reg. No.: DE 15466059.

At the customer’s request we will take back CeoTronics products that have reached the end of their service life and fall under the WEEE regulation, in order to recycle or dispose of them in accordance with the WEEE guidelines.

Within the EU, affected customers must contact CeoTronics AG in Rödermark to obtain appropriate information on the disposal/collection of waste equipment.

What is the WEEE label?

CeoTronics WEEE products (or the packaging) can be identified by the icon of the rubbish bin with a line through it. This means that devices must not be disposed of together with normal commercial or household waste.

How does recycling/disposal take place?

At the end of the service life of the WEEE products of CeoTronics, customers can ask CeoTronics to collect them for professional recycling and disposal.
